MODIFICATION COMMITTEE

As the head of the Modification Committee, I would like to answer the questions I have been asked by the entire community.

#1 Are fire pits allowed? No, not at this time.

#2 Can I have a roof color other than Black or Dark Charcoal? **No.**

#3 What happens to the Violation Fine monies that are collected? **The monies received from Violation Fines gets applied to our HOA's Reserve Fund.**

#4 How long will it take for my Modification request to be approved? Although the Modification Committee has up to 45 days to review and approve/disapprove a request, the vast majority are completed in 3 or 4 days.

So far this year one request was approved in 45 minutes, another in 54 minutes, a couple in over a month, and one has been going on since last Thanksgiving.

Remember that it is very important that you complete a Modification Request and submit same to the Modification Committee for review and approval before you start your project.

The Dirt Band has pruned shrubbery at our Burning Ridge and Myrtle Ridge entrances. The shrubs in the flagpole garden were also trimmed.

The Dirt Band continued its weed control and fire ant eradication programs. Weed and grass killer was applied to the clubhouse flagpole and circle garden beds and to the perimeter of the pool deck and to the gardens adjacent to the clubhouse.

Fire ant killer was applied to nests at the clubhouse grounds and driveway edges. Fire ant kills for this period were 147,554. This brings the year to date total to 1,532,897.




MEDICAL SUPPLIES

We gave this book our rating of 9 1/2. A very good read.

November's book will be a family history as well, but this time it will be historical fiction based on the life of an early American midwife named Martha Ballard. The Frozen River by Ariel Lawson is a true story of a woman living in Hallowell, ME who serves as the town's doctor as well as its midwife since the town is too far from Boston and too small to employ its own physician. MS Ballard is called to investigate a dead man pulled from the ice on the Kennebec River. Her discovery puts her into a scandal and trial that changes everything in her town's society and history.

- Stay in the kitchen when you are cooking on the stovetop so you can keep an eye on the food.
- Stay in the home when cooking your turkey and check on it frequently.
- Keep children away from the stove. The stove will be hot and kids should stay 3 feet away.
- Make sure kids stay away from hot food and liquids.
 The steam or splash from vegetables, gravy or coffee could cause serious burns.
- Keep the floor clear so you don't trip over kids, toys, pocketbooks or bags.
- Keep knives out of the reach of children.
- Be sure electric cords from an electric knife, coffee maker, plate warmer or mixer are not dangling off the counter within easy reach of a child.
- Keep matches and utility lighters out of the reach of children — up high in a locked cabinet.
- Never leave children alone in room with a lit candle.
- Make sure your smoke alarms are working. Test them by pushing the test button.



Have activities that keep kids out of the kitchen during this busy time. Games, puzzles or books can keep them busy. Kids can get involved in Thanksgiving preparations with recipes that can be done outside the kitchen.





FIREWISE ACTIVITIES MATCHING FUNDS RECORDING SHEET

Can be used to record activities for matching funds and other Firewise Communities/USA

What qualifies for matching funds for Firewise grants? Any time or money you spend on your home and/or surrounding property for the purpose of reducing the probability of wildfire loss. Examples of activities that will qualify related to homes and outbuildings are:

Dryer vent cleaning, pruning, mulching, tree trimming/limbing, weed abatement/spraying, replacing combustible mulches with stone/gravel, leaf raking and removal, pine needle/pine cone removal, cleaning gutters, grass cutting, grass irrigation, edging, time spent hauling vegetation to landfill/dump sites, meetings, presentations, cost for purchase or rental of chain saw/hedge trimmers, cost or protective eyewear/earplugs.

Volunteer activities also qualify for Firewise matching funds. Volunteer activities can include: attending Firewise Board Meetings, attending Firewise community events and preparation for wildfire.
