





News from the Board Joyce Jalbert, President

<u>Electricity on Sand Ridge:</u> As everyone is aware the electricity, thus the light illuminating our sign, has not been working for several months now. After obtaining three bids, we decided to hire Elite Electric to fix the problem. They have done work for us in the past and we have found them to be dependable and cost efficient. I am happy to announce that work was completed on February 17th.

The original bid quote was \$1367.00. When Bill from Elite called to tell me that the job was done, he told me that the break was exactly where he thought it was and the job turned out to be quicker than he anticipated so.....he is working up a new LOWER priced invoice for us. Needless to say, I was surprised and very thankful. So, thanks so much to Bill and his crew for a job well done!

Roof: Recently the Clubhouse was inspected by our Insurance Company (in anticipation of our renewal). The Inspector found that we needed to have our roof inspected for possible replacement. So, Cristina and I went into overdrive and reached out to 4 roofers for an inspection. The inspector only gave us 30 days to respond back to her findings. Well...what an adventure we went on. 2 companies gave us a quote on replacement and 2 companies said "hold the phone you don't need a new roof".

So, upon more digging by Cristina, it was discovered that our roof was replaced in October of 2019 by Coastal Roofing for \$7700.00.

I would like to thank both Baker Roofing and Monarch Roofing for being honest with us and telling us the roof was OK. And not just out to make a quick buck at our expense. Monarch did send us many pictures of our roof and did discover that some of our corner eave drip edges are in need of repair, as illustrated below. We have contracted with them to complete the work. The cost is **\$973.00**.

SAFETY TIPS

- Pets are curious. They may bump into, turn on, or knock over cooking equipment. Keep pets away from stoves and countertops.
- Keep pets away from candles, lamps, and space heaters.
- Always use a metal or heat-tempered glass screen on a fireplace and keep it in place.
- Keep pets away from a chimney's outside vents.
 Have a "pet-free zone" of at least 3 feet (1 meter)
 away from the fireplace. Glass doors and screens
 can stay dangerously hot for several hours after the
 fire goes out.
- Consider battery-operated, flameless candles.
 They can look and smell like real candles.
- Some pets are chewers. Watch pets to make sure they don't chew through electrical cords. Have any problems checked by a professional.

SMOKE ALARMS

- Have working smoke alarms on every level of the home. Test your smoke alarms at least once a month.
- If the smoke alarm sounds, get out and stay out.
- Never go back inside for pets in a fire. Tell firefighters if your pet is trapped.

Pets and Wildfires

Make sure pets are included in your family's wildfire evacuation plan. Build an evacuation kit for each pet in your household. Ensure each kit is a size and weight that can be quickly and easily loaded into a vehicle when packing to evacuate.



FACT

Pets or wild animals have a part in starting about 750 home fires per year. These involve cooking equipment, fireplaces and chimneys, space heaters, lamps, bulbs, wiring, and candles.

FIREWISE ACTIVITIES MATCHING FUNDS RECORDING SHEET

Can be used to record activities for matching funds and other Firewise Communities/USA

What qualifies for matching funds for Firewise grants? Any time or money you spend on your home and/or surrounding property for the purpose of reducing the probability of wildfire loss. Examples of activities that will qualify related to homes and outbuildings are:

Dryer vent cleaning, pruning, mulching, tree trimming/limbing, weed abatement/spraying, replacing combustible mulches with stone/gravel, leaf raking and removal, pine needle/pine cone removal, cleaning gutters, grass cutting, grass irrigation, edging, time spent hauling vegetation to landfill/dump sites, meetings, presentations, cost for purchase or rental of chain saw/hedge trimmers, cost or protective eyewear/earplugs.

Volunteer activities also qualify for Firewise matching funds. Volunteer activities can include: attending Firewise Board Meetings, attending Firewise community events and preparation for wildfire.
