MTS DIRT BAND

Glen Daniels, Chair Grounds Maintenance and Beautification Committee

Purpose: The Grounds/Maintenance committee is a voluntary group commissioned by and reporting to the MTS Board of Directors. The committee is responsible for advising the board on matters pertaining to common area property maintenance. The board must receive committee recommendations in September for use in developing the annual budget.

Responsibilities: The committee will review all aspects of common area property maintenance and recommend purchasing or renting equipment; plantings, etc., and prepare and present recommendations to the board. The committee will interact with the lawn services contractor for assisting with projects. An annual planting request/diagram will be sent to the modification committee for approval by the September BOD meeting.

Committee organization: The committee shall consist of three to five members appointed by the board. The committee shall meet as frequently as necessary. Minutes will be taken at all committee meetings.

Relationship to board: A copy of all committee meeting minutes will be sent to the board. Major expenditures must be approved in advance by the board. A proposed annual budget shall be submitted to the board by the September BOD meeting. Activities will be presented to the BOD at the monthly meeting.

The paragraphs above represent our current GMBC Committee structure and required commitments. Those which are most generally followed are highlighted. Not included but provided services include:

Interaction with the Community:

Requesting help when a particular activity requires more folks operating handled implements (think Rakes!) than the committee alone can provide, e.g. mulching the Circle Garden in the Spring, helping out with the Spring and Fall Cleanups, and some assistance being requested for our Christmas decoration placements. Generally, response is good for our projects, and many of our neighbors admit to having had a pretty good time even though a quick glance at the jobs tend to evoke more thoughts about being worn out than gratified. This is an amazing community when we pull together as a group. Donuts and coffee from time to time don't hurt either.

Down and Dirty:

Pest control, whether it be weeds or invasive critters, is high up on our list of chores. Our ground-penetrating radar (useful for compiling Fire Ant kills) has not been operational due to budget cuts in the Firewise program, but we feel we have maintained our standards and are comfortable that this is still a highly effective program. We hope to return to the Ant Mortality reports when funding is restored.

Behind the Scenes:

Our friends at Hardee Landscaping continue to do their level best to provide high quality mowing, trimming and many other services to the Community. Many times I have relied upon their good graces to come to our aid after storms, flooding events and other general Mother Nature tantrums to help get our community looking good again. Regardless of any one person's experiences with them, I find them to be a great asset to us in the broader field of keeping our overall look good. Nobody is perfect all the time. But - Ask any realtor who's sold a house here, what they've heard.

All of which is meant to say that GMBC rocks! Plus anyone who has contributed their time, talents and sweat to keep things looking great here. You're all a bunch of budding arborists and landscapers, and everything you contribute continues to make us look good, or better, building up to great.

Gentle Exercise is offered every Tuesday and Thursday at our Clubhouse from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. "Gentle" means just that; exercise designed for 55+ women and men. The DVDs used offer work to improve balance (so important as we age), cardio, and upper and lower body exercise.

Exercises are done both sitting and standing. Generally, the hour includes one half hour of movement and one half hour of sitting Yoga for relaxation.

Do a favor for your body. Commit yourself to begin with three times and see how much better you begin to feel for the new year.

10 Tips

Get Ahead of the Winter Freeze

It's not too early to begin preparing for the heating season.
Check these 10 tips off your list and get ahead of the winter freeze.

- Our **furnace has been inspected and serviced** by a qualified professional during the last 12 months. (A furnace should be serviced at least once a year.)
- Our **chimneys and vents have been cleaned and inspected** by a qualified professional. I have checked for creosote built-up. (Not cleaning your chimney is the leading cause of chimney fires from built up creosote. This service needs to be done at least once a year.)
- Our wood for our fireplace or wood stove is **dry, seasoned wood**.
- Our **fireplace screen is metal or heat-tempered glass**, in good condition and secure in its position in front of the fireplace.
- We have a **covered metal container** ready to use to dispose cooled ashes. (The ash container should be kept at least 10 feet from the home and any nearby buildings.)
- Our children know to stay at least **3 feet away** from the fireplace, wood/pellet stove, oil stove or other space heaters.
- Our portable space heaters have an **automatic shut-off**.
- Our portable space heaters will be **plugged directly into an outlet** (not an extension cord) and placed at least three feet from anything that can burn; like bedding, paper, walls, and even people. (Place notes throughout your home to remind you to turn off portable heaters when you leave a room or go to bed.)
- We have **tested our smoke alarms** and made sure they are working. (You need smoke alarms on every level of the home, inside each sleeping room and outside each separate sleeping area. For the best protection, the smoke alarms should be interconnected so when one sounds, they all sound.)
- We have **tested our carbon monoxide alarms** and made sure they are working. (Carbon monoxide alarms should be located outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home.)

FIREWISE ACTIVITIES MATCHING FUNDS RECORDING SHEET

Can be used to record activities for matching funds and other Firewise Communities/USA

What qualifies for matching funds for Firewise grants? Any time or money you spend on your home and/or surrounding property for the purpose of reducing the probability of wildfire loss. Examples of activities that will qualify related to homes and outbuildings are:

Dryer vent cleaning, pruning, mulching, tree trimming/limbing, weed abatement/spraying, replacing combustible mulches with stone/gravel, leaf raking and removal, pine needle/pine cone removal, cleaning gutters, grass cutting, grass irrigation, edging, time spent hauling vegetation to landfill/dump sites, meetings, presentations, cost for purchase or rental of chain saw/hedge trimmers, cost or protective eyewear/earplugs.

Volunteer activities also qualify for Firewise matching funds. Volunteer activities can include: attending Firewise Board Meetings, attending Firewise community events and preparation for wildfire.
